




To get your sheep listed follow these simple instructions.

1). Go to “Services” and then “Sheep for Sale”




2). This page displays all the sale groups you have set up, as either on-farm, auction or semen sales. The default is “on-farm” sales – click on the relevant tab to see the other types.

Initially you won’t have any sales listed – but click “Create New Sale Listing” to get started.



3). "Select sale type" and provide a sale name, postcode (your postcode or the auction) and the dates between which you wish to see animals advertised. Once completed click "Next".





5). Repeat the procedure for each animal of interest. On completion press “Save List”



6). After pressing “Save List” you will return to the main sale group page, where your group is now listed under one of the tabs. Here you can edit or delete the group – or renew the listing, if the expiry date has passed.




7). Go to “Sheep Search” and then “Search Sheep for Sale” to see your entries listed.


Consider adding notes and images
